

## ACADEMIC SERVICES

### EMERSON ACADEMY

*Emerson Academy Therapeutic School* provide academic services to students referred from the St. Louis Public Schools in grades K-12. We offer an alternative educational setting for students with behavioral and learning challenges.



Our curriculum consists of:

- Math
- Language Arts
- Science
- Individual Education Plan (IEP)
- Behavior Modification
- Individual and Group Therapeutic Services
- Library Services
- Physical Education and Recreation
- Remedial Reading

Our program also provides a variety of enriching activities such as field trips, computer classes and extracurricular activities. At the academy, as in all our programs, our children have the opportunity to learn trust, independence, self-confidence, and effective social skills.

## FOOD SERVICES

*Annie Malone Children & Family Service Center* provides healthy, well-balanced, nutritious meals 365 days a year, for all children participating in agency programs. In addition, we offer food services through our *Annie M's Seventh Story Café at the Carnahan building*, located on Market Street. The café provides employment opportunities for older youth in our programs. A portion of the proceeds from the café is used to help offset the cost of programs and services at the agency.

## HISTORY

Established in 1888, to care for neglected and orphaned colored children, *Annie Malone Children & Family Service Center*, first opened its doors as the St. Louis Colored Orphans' Home. In 1946, the home was renamed in honor of the late Annie M. Turnbo Malone for her unwavering service on the Board of Directors from 1919 to 1943. During the 1980s, Annie Malone Children's Home expanded its services to respond to the changing needs of the community. In 2007, the agency focused on entrepreneurial endeavors and opened its first cafe in downtown St. Louis. During 2008, the Residential Treatment site moved to a new building affectionately dubbed, Annie's Place. In 2009, Emerson Academy Therapeutic School moved to the North wing of Annie's Place. Later that year, the Transitional Living Program shifted its location to the Malone House, 5341 Page Blvd.

We believe that strong family connections are key to strengthening and stabilizing the community.



Today we are supported through partnerships with a variety of those who help us carry out our mission to serve the community. They are the United Way of Greater St. Louis, the Deaconess Foundation, the Child Welfare

League of America, and the Missouri Department of Social Services Family Support Division. Annie Malone Children & Family Service Center is internationally accredited by the Council on Accreditation (COA).

Annie Malone Children & Family Service Center is a 501(c)3, not-for-profit community-based organization.

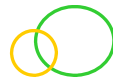

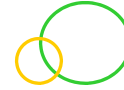

## RESIDENTIAL SERVICES

### RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT

Our 24 hour therapeutic residential services provides care for children ages 6 to 18. Children who have been removed from parental custody due to abuse, neglect and abandonment are placed with our agency to receive intensive early intervention services which include:

- 24-Hour Supervision
- Emergency and Long Term Care
- Assessment, Treatment Planning and Therapeutic Intervention
- Individual, Group, and Family Therapy
- Contracted Medical/Psychiatric Services
- Life Skills Development



Our services are provided by certified, professionally trained social workers, recreational therapists, medical personnel, psychologists, special-education teachers, and contracted psychiatrists. Where appropriate, family members are included in all phases of assessment, planning, and treatment of the child. Residential treatment services are offered at Annie's Place located at 5355 Page Blvd.

### TRANSITIONAL LIVING PROGRAM

Transitional Living Program (TLP) provides youth between the ages of 16 and 21 the necessary skills to successfully transition to independent, productive adults through a series of personal training and life skills development. Program services are offered at the Malone House, located at 5341 Page Blvd. Program participants receive life skills necessary for home management, budgeting and finance, decision-making and problem solving. Participants also explore career planning, and employment training options. Depending on individual goals, program runs for 12 to 18 months.

## CRISIS & FAMILY SERVICES

### CRISIS NURSERY & TEEN CRISIS

Crisis Nursery (birth to 12), Teen Crisis and Juvenile Court Respite services for youth ages 13-18 allows families the opportunity to lessen their overwhelming stress, thus decreasing the likelihood for abuse, neglect, or abandonment.

We provide 24 hour supervision and care to all clients receiving services. During the school year, participants will also receive academic services at Emerson Academy Therapeutic School or in their regular school district.

Crisis Nursery and Teen Crisis allow 3-5 days initially and up to 13 days annually. The Juvenile Court Respite program has a maximum of 5 days per placement, with an assigned Deputy Juvenile Officer (DJO)/Child Division Worker (CDW). In all cases, assessments are conducted and follow-up evaluations are rendered.



### PARENTING EDUCATION

Our parenting classes empower parents with the necessary tools to nurture their children into becoming healthy, productive citizens. Classes focus on age appropriate discipline, developmental expectations, and behavior modification techniques for successfully raising a child. These classes offer parents an opportunity to recognize positives yet make necessary changes in their homes.
